P.1 Born in Kendal, 1907. Remembers sinking of Titanic and assassination of Duke Ferdinand.
Father served with Kendal Pals in Boer War; died 1909.
Business (Thompsons) began inside Woolworths, 1890-1900.
Stepfather managed wholesale newspaper firm, then expanded tobacco business (Gates's).

P.2 Approached by manager of LMS railway to begin agency.
Lived on Beast Banks, Ghyllside, Fisher Mount.
Attended Kendal Grammar School, Moore headmaster.
Fellow pupil of - Willan who became a judge.

P.3 Gt-aunt headmistress of Kirkland School (Elizabeth Garnett).

Lord Lowther's visitors to Kendal; entertaining the Kaiser before 1914.
Mr O'Neill, chief constable, took respondent to see Buck Ruxton relics.

P.8 Kendal murders - Liptrot and Hadwin. Tottie Smith, chief constable.
Election days. Sergeant Heap.
Parliamentary result declared at Appleby; victorious candidate returned to Kendal to balcony at Town Hall.

P.9 Shops boarded up at election time; traffic stopped.
Competing with Town Hall clock when announcing results.

P.21 Driving sheep and cows down Beast Banks.
Cow stuck in underground passage from baths to river.
Flooding of the Kent.
New Romney Bridge.

P.22 Tricks played whilst a child.
Friend was policeman, worked on cruise liner, then on children's educational cruises, then checked petrol pumps in N.E. and N.W.
Old practices in Police Force.

P.23 Services provided by Gates's.
Kendal station/line between Windermere & Kendal/Windermere station.

P.24 Settle-Carlisle line.
Hardwick engines. Engines stood at Oxenholme for banking purposes.
Travel to Grange via Hincaster. Kendal Tommy ran from Kendal to Arnside, then Furness railway to Grange or Barrow.
Kendal people used train to have a day at Sandside or Arnside.

P.25 Excursion to Southport for 1/6d - with extra carriages.
Railtrack profits.

P.26 Special trips arranged by Michael Gates.
Carriers used for transporting tobacco.
Details of carriers. Moses Hully, carrier from Tebay, had a Fiat; Jackson worked Burton; Dick Gardner worked Crosthwaite; Ellwoods, Rainbow Yard, went to Ulverston; Dick Burrow did Sedbergh with horse and cart.

P.27 Gates's got a van. Parked in Rainbow Yard.
Police on point duty at top of Finkle Street.

P.28 Wilf Miller, Toc H.
Police station accommodation.
Fire bell outside police station. Merryweather steam engine for fire fighting.

P.29 Volunteer firemen turned out for Mayor's Sunday.
Mr Langhorn, builder.
