- P.13 Brother died at ten months.  
Working on the farm as children, milking at six years old.  
Home baking.  
Moved to The Heights at Ings.
- P.14 Attended Ings School. Born December 1914.  
Moved to Cunswick, aged 16.  
Farm at Shap Wells "like a rabbit warren" - now rebuilt.  
Cunswick Hall 500 acres.  
Worked outside all through World War II.
- P.15 Ploughing with horses (kept 13 at one time). Kept own stallion.  
Jack Button had travelling stallion.  
Blacksmiths at Kendal and Burneside.
- P.16 Went dancing (by bike) to Crook, Underbarrow, Crosthwaite, Hutton, Grayrigg; once over Shap.  
Big room at Cunswick Hall used for dances and 21st birthday parties.  
Sister spent 2½ years in hospital as a girl with dislocated hips - later had three children.
- P.17 Married from Cunswick Hall.  
Lived on Windermere Road looking after her two children and her mother.  
Winter of 1947.  
Sister had baby at Cunswick Hall. Had to go for district nurse and doctor with tractor.  
Getting to Kendal.
- P.18 Road from Black Head through Cunsmire Wood.  
Getting to school.  
Travelling salesmen selling artificial manures; basic slag.  
Muck sealer.
- P.19 Muck spreading in 45 acre field.  
Land Army.  
Alfred, German prisoner of war, lived in (baker by trade).
- P.20 Prisoner of war returned home to Black Forest.  
Killing pigs during war.  
New regulation about pig killing after war.
- P.21 Curing the pig meat.  
Saltpetre.  
Treatment of flitches and hams.
- P.22 Buying Herdwick sheep at Troutbeck auction and killing for mutton.
- P.23 Herdwick meat.  
Ploughing during the war - bad harvests.
